EU Values and democratic rules

Democracy is a key European value.

The EU is committed to **upholding democratic principles and the fundamental values** that unite us. The European Union has worked hard in the current legislative period to **preserve and advance democracy** within the EU and on the global stage.

Key legislative highlights this term:

Media Freedom and Pluralism

Media Freedom Act

The EU has adopted new rules to oblige member states to ensure media pluralism and **protect media independence from governmental, political, economic or private interference.**

Defence of Democracy

• <u>Rule of Law Conditionality</u> A new regulation was adopted allows the **EU to stop payments from its budget to countries that violate fundamental democratic principles**.

Fundamental and Equal Rights

- <u>Women on boards</u> By the end of June 2026, companies with more than 249 employees are required to ensure a **minimum of 40% non-executive directors are women**.
- Equal Pay

To address the gender pay gap, new rules make companies **share salary info** and **let workers see what others in their job category earn**. They can also seek **compensation** if they face pay discrimination.

• EP Reform

Parliament changed its rules to fight corruption. Now, MEPs have to say **who they meet from interest groups** and **other countries**.
